The 2016-17 school year was a big milestone for Frameworks! In the 2016-17 school year, our team positively impacted nearly 33,000 students at 60 schools and youth-serving organizations in the Tampa Bay area; we have since increased our impact in the 2017-18 school year to more than 41,000 students at 64 sites.

During the 2016-17 year, together with Hillsborough County Public Schools, we completed the second year of our middle school project. Our students are reaching new heights in their journey towards strengthening their social and emotional skills. When they move on to 9th grade, these students will be better prepared for the social and emotional challenges that high school brings, including new social pressures and important academic benchmarks.

In the 2016-17 year, our team provided over 10,000 hours of support to our partners and fellow educators. We are so proud of the work that has been accomplished so far, and it would not have been possible without you! Thank you for your continuous support of our mission to teach youth to manage their emotions, develop healthy relationships, and make good decisions for academic, career, and personal success.

Additionally, Frameworks provides direct services to students participating in Teens In Action.

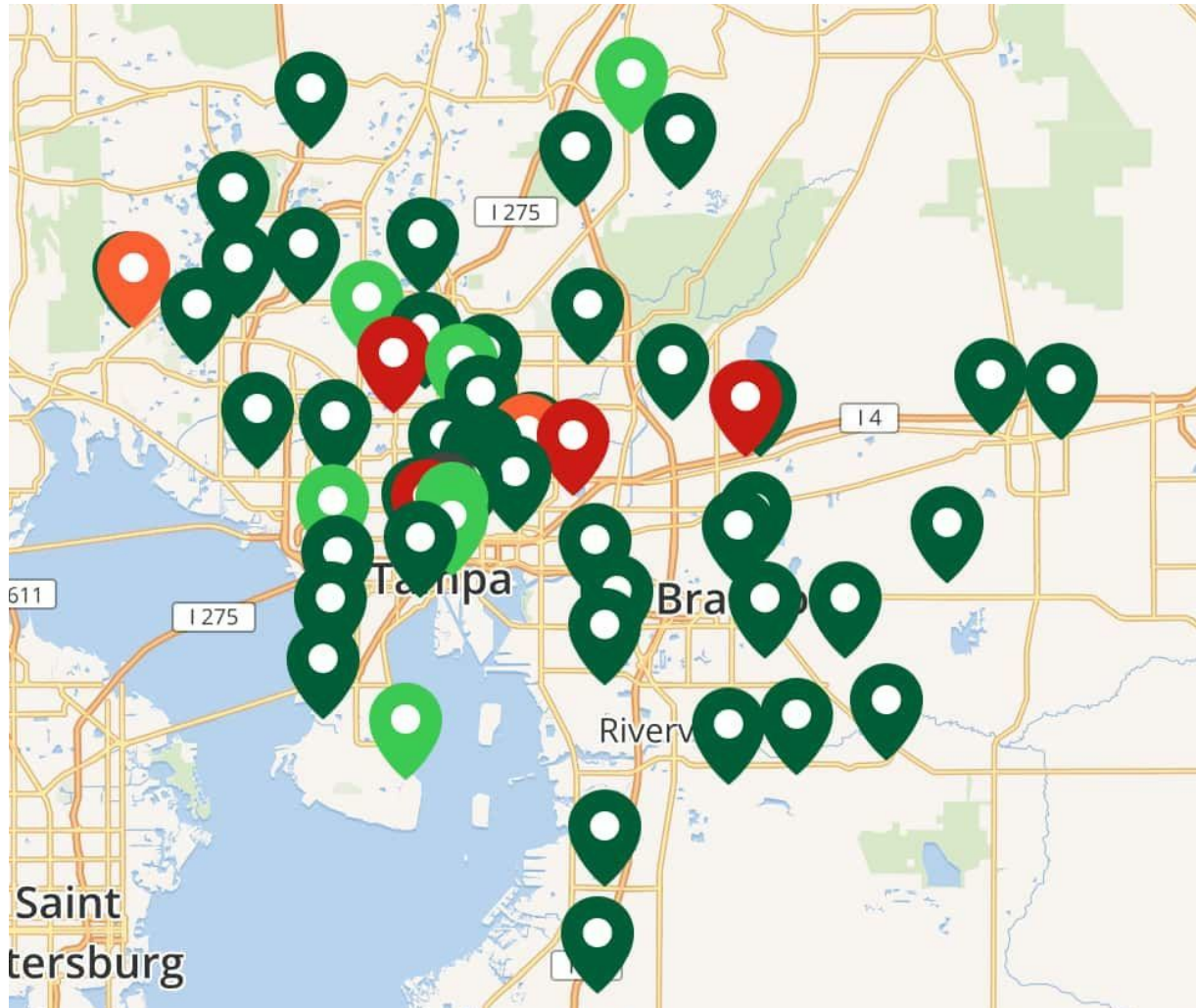

The Community Building Sessions program is a universal method of building positive school community and should be used throughout the school year with entire grade level populations.

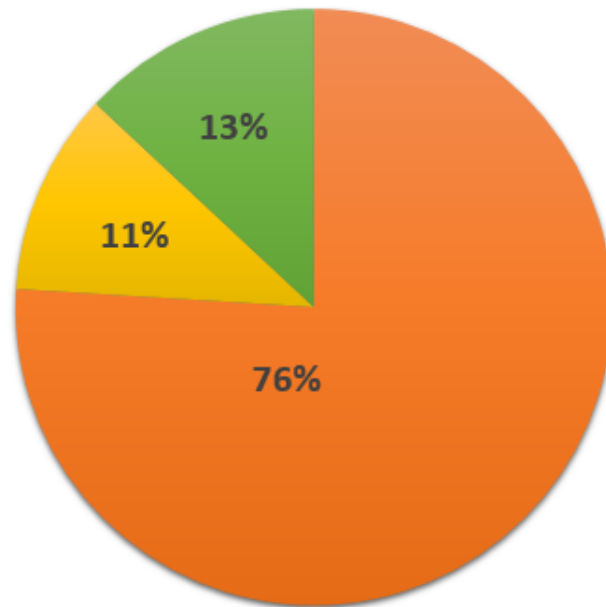

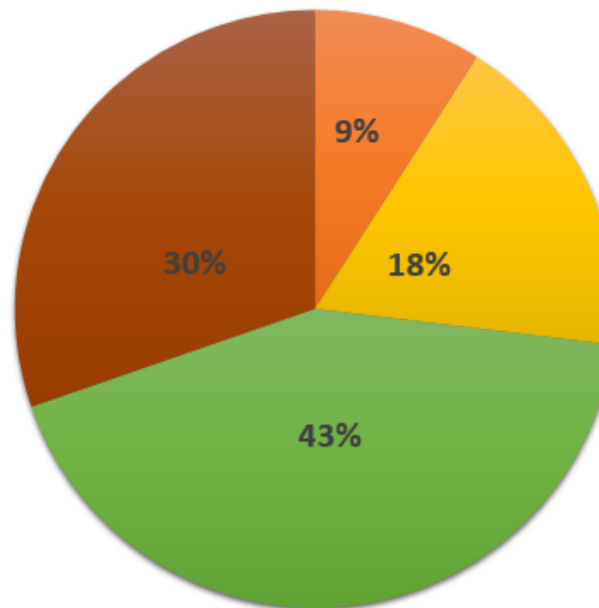

Total Expenses \$878,706



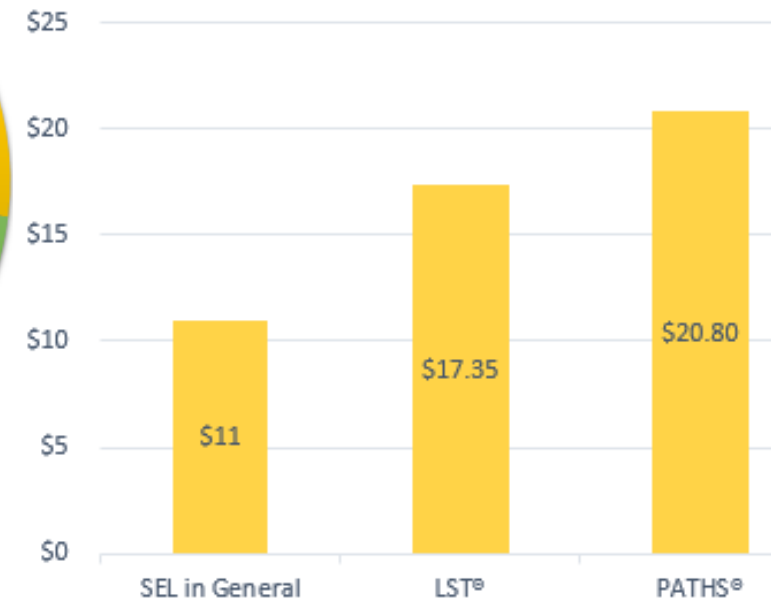
